Student Government has allocated a record amount of funding so far, totaling over \$1.1 million in annual and weekly budget requests to over 100 student organizations. Given this, Student Government has decided to limit new weekly budget request allocations. Groups must utilize their annual budgets before requesting more funds. Funds in the annual budgets can be reallocated for different programs through the reallocation budget request item on OurCampus. See instructions below.
