Approaching Deadlines for Seniors:

- <u>Gates Cambridge Scholarship</u> Provides graduate funding at Cambridge University for international students or US citizens currently residing outside of the US. Official Deadline: 1 Dec or 5 January (depending upon course of study)
- <u>Ford Foundation Predoctoral Fellowship</u> Funding for doctoral study at US universities. Official Deadline: 15 December
- <u>Graduate Fellowships for STEM Diversity</u> Funding for up to 6 years of postgraduate study with a GFSD university, includes 2 paid summer internships. Open to US citizens. Official Deadline: 15 December
- <u>Elie Wiesel Prize in Ethics</u> Open to juniors/seniors. Submit an essay on any topic as long as it pertains to ethics. Website includes examples of previously winning essays. Prizes range from \$10,000 to \$1,000. Official Deadline: 30 December
- <u>Saltire Scholarship</u> Funds postgraduate study at a Scottish university in a wide array of <u>fields of study</u>. Open to citizens of the US, Canada, China (including Hong Kong), Japan, India or Pakistan. Official Deadline: 30 December
- Zero Hunger Internship 10 week paid summer internship working with anti-hunger organizations, includes seminars, leadership development, experience working with nonprofit operations, policy analysis, program implementation, fundraising practices, and a group research project as well as other perks. Official Deadline: 13 January
- <u>Bill Emerson National Hunger Fellowship</u> An 11-month paid fellowship working to combat hunger and poverty. Includes field placements with a local or regional focus followed by policy placements with national advocacy groups, think tanks and government agencies. Perks include funding at select graduate schools. US citizens or permanent residents. Official Deadline: 13 January (applications open 1 Dec)
- Mickey Leland International Hunger Fellowship A 2-year international experience training emerging leaders in international development and/or the movement to end hunger worldwide, building food and nutrition security at the field and policy level. Spend one year living in the Global South. NOTE: Most fellows have a graduate degree, although a bachelor's degree with 1-2 years of work or volunteer experience is also adequate. US citizens and permanent legal residents. Official Deadline: 13 January
- <u>Hillary Rodham Clinton Award for Peace & Reconciliation</u> Full tuition-fees for postgraduate study (1 year master's degree) at Queen's University Belfast (N. Ireland). The 5 MA programs eligible are: LLM Huan Rights Law, MA Conflict Transformation & Social Justice, MA Global Security & Borders, MA Politics, or MA Violence, Terrorism & Security. Open to US citizens who identify as female. Official Deadline: 27 January
- <u>Foreign Affairs IT Fellowship</u> Funds postgraduate study in an IT-related master's program in the US. Agree to a 5-year stint with the Foreign Service upon completion of studies. Must be a US citizen. Official Deadline: 3 February
