## **Approaching Deadlines for Sophomores:**

- Goldwater Scholarship: STEM scholarship for students planning to pursue a research based doctoral, medical or veterinary medicine, or medical/veterinary + doctoral degree graduate program. You <u>must</u> follow our campus application instructions. <u>Campus</u> <u>Application Deadline: 12 December</u>
- <u>Boren Scholarship</u>: (for semester or longer OR summer STEM study abroad): For study abroad in a non-western country, must include language study. See <u>official website</u> for details. You <u>must</u> follow our campus application instructions. <u>Campus Application</u>
   <u>Deadline: 30 December</u>
- Humanity in Action Fellowship Explore issues of social justice, human rights, politics of memory and remembrance culture, and civic engagement. Examine ways in which communities co-exist to create a pluralistic society, and the structural challenges arising from asymmetrical power dynamics. This 12 month fellowship includes a summer experience in a host country plus your own action program. Program locations: US, Berlin, Copenhagen, Warsaw, Amsterdam and Sarajevo. Applicants select program of their choice. Applications open 5 December/Official Deadline early January (date TBD)
- Zero Hunger Internship A 10 week paid summer internship working with anti-hunger organizations, includes seminars, leadership development, experience working with nonprofit operations, policy analysis, program implementation, fundraising practices, and a group research project as well as other perks. Official Deadline: 13 January
- <u>Udall</u> For sophomores/juniors with a commitment to issues related to the environment or Native American nations. Students must be US citizens, US nationals or Permanent Residents <u>and/or</u> Native Americans, Alaskan Natives or members of First Nations of Canada. Campus Application Deadline: 30 January
- Hollings Undergraduate Scholarship Available to sophomores in a wide array of academic disciplines (see website). The Scholarship includes a paid summer internship at NOAA facilities across the US, an annual stipend to support your undergraduate studies, and other benefits. Must be a US citizen to apply. - Foreign Affairs IT Fellowship (FAIT) Empowering the next generation of technology leaders in the US Foreign Service, this very lucrative fellowship provides 2 years of funding for tuition/fees, 2 summer paid internships (one domestic and one international with the State Department), professional development and guaranteed employment as a Foreign Service Information Management Specialist. Open to sophomores enrolled in an IT-related field of study. Must be a US citizen. Official Deadline: 3 February
- <u>US-UK Summer Institutes</u> Spend 3-4 weeks in the UK at one of 5 Fulbright UK Summer Institutes. Open to US citizens who have no or very little travel experience outside of North America. Official Deadline 7 February (applications open 30 Nov) For more information, contact <u>Dean Morris</u>
- Rangel Summer Enrichment
   This 6 week summer program provides students with a deeper appreciation of current issues and trends in international affairs, a greater understanding of career opportunities and the knowledge and skills to pursue such

- careers. Includes 2 courses and a seminar related to US foreign policy and economics, mentorship and networking, career and graduate school advice, and other benefits including a stipend and program costs. Must be a US citizen. Official Deadline: 7
  February
- Amgen Scholars Program (US) STEM students interested in biotechnology or biomedical sciences, engage in summer full-time independent research projects under the guidance of a research scientist. Visit each Amgen host institution for project/discipline foci. Includes seminars, research symposium, and networking events. Open to US citizens, permanent residents, or DACA. Official Deadline: 1 February
- Amgen Scholars Program (Asia) STEM students interested in biotechnology or biomedical sciences, engage in summer full-time independent research projects under the guidance of a research scientist. Visit each Amgen host institution for project/discipline foci. Includes seminars, research symposium, and networking events. Open to students regardless of citizenship. Official Deadline: 1 February.
